It is our goal to have the monument completed in time for commemoration ceremonies scheduled for next year.

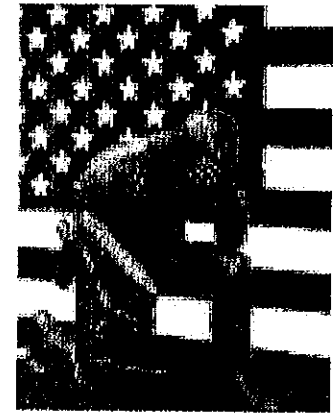
Madera County has tragically lost seven members of law enforcement.

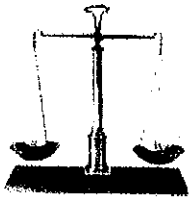
Nationwide, cities and counties have erected monuments memorializing those who selflessly put their lives on the line to ensure the safety of their fellow man.
